


## Dr. Diep Nguyen's Biography



Diep Nguyen (Ph. D.) is the President and CEO of the Center of Applied Linguistics (CAL) leading a team of researchers and educational leaders to advocate for and support multilingual education policies and practices in the US and elsewhere. Prior to joining CAL, she served as Director of Research and Educator Learning, and subsequently as Senior Director of Research and Academic Outreach for WIDA at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. In this role, Diep lead a team of researchers and professional Learning specialists to conduct research, develop the 2020 Standards and provide professional learning services and resources to the WIDA consortium. She has more than three decades of experience in teaching, research and school leadership administration serving multilingual learners. She had conducted research on the long-term impacts of Dual Language Education programs on students and teacher's efficacy to serve multilingual learners. Her latest research interest is investigating the experiences of Asian American educational leaders as they navigate racism and other forms of discrimination in K-12 settings and the academia. She is the co-author, with Margo Gottlieb, of the book "Assessment and Accountability in Language Education Programs" (Caslon, 2007). Dr. Nguyen earned her Ph.D. in Educational Studies and her M.A. in French Literature from the Ohio State University. She received her B.S. in Secondary Education from West Virginia University.
